INTRODUCTION

As a holder of the Slovenia Green label (the Municipality of Idrija has held the gold label since 2022), the Idrija destination is committed to preparing an action plan for sustainable measures and submitting annual reports on implemented sustainability activities within the municipality.

In 2023, we prepared the Action Plan for Implementation of Sustainable Measures for the Idrija Destination for the period 2023–2025, with the aim of upgrading our sustainability efforts and maintaining the awarded Slovenia Green Destination – Gold Label. The action plan was approved by the municipal council.

The 2023–2025 plan includes a wide range of sustainability activities across various sectors, as environmental protection, social responsibility, and economic development must be addressed comprehensively. In addition to the Idrija Tourism Board, the plan was developed in collaboration with the Municipality of Idrija, Komunala Idrija, local tourism providers, and other organizations. A green, environmentally and socially responsible destination is not just the task of the local tourism organization – it is something that can only be achieved together.

After the first year of implementation, we prepared the 2023 annual report, and this document presents the report for 2024. Preparing annual reports is a requirement for maintaining the Slovenia Green label. In autumn 2025 (every third year), a new comprehensive evaluation will take place for the renewal of the label.

The 2024 annual report was prepared by the Idrija Tourism Board in cooperation with various stakeholders in our municipality.

We assess that the destination has been very successful in implementing the planned measures—some areas have seen greater progress, while others slightly less—but this report provides a comprehensive overview and testifies to the ongoing sustainability efforts in the Idriia destination.

1.11 Monitoring Visitor Satisfaction	In 2024, the Idrija Tourism Institute began conducting a Visitor Survey for the Idrija destination, which will continue into 2025. By the end of 2024, we collected 122 responses; the results will be presented after the survey is completed, in the second half of 2025. Surveys for tourism providers and residents have also been prepared and will be conducted in 2025.
1.12 Management of Tourist Traffic	At the Idrija Tourism Institute, we actively promote a diverse range of offerings across the destination to encourage the distribution of visitors and direct tourism traffic to multiple locations throughout Idrija.
1.13 Alleviating pressure on central attractions	By creating joint tickets, we guide visitors toward exploring less-visited attractions. In 2024, the sale of joint tickets continued. One new joint ticket was added – the Family Idrija Breakfast combined with a visit to the Idrija Visitor Center.
1.14 Visitor behavior in vulnerable areas	In 2024, two more employees of the Idrija Tourism Institute participated in training for nature conservation inspectors. We also continued discussions with a candidate who passed the exam for volunteer nature conservation inspector in 2023 and has expressed willingness to perform voluntary inspections in the future.
1.15 Monitoring of sustainability indicators	Sustainability indicators are monitored annually and published on the visit-idrija.si website on the Green Scheme page. In 2024, we prepared and published the indicators for 2023.
1.16 Monitoring and evaluation of sustainability goals	In January 2024, the Green Coordinator, together with the Green Team and collaborators, prepared the annual report on implemented measures for 2023, which was presented to the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Idrija. Natural Parks of Slovenia Community Quiz – School Year 2024/25
On 13 December 2024, the Idrija Tourism Institute held a meeting with the Intermunicipal Inspectorate and law enforcement agencies of the municipalities of Idrija and Cerkno to establish joint visitor monitoring and control actions in UILP.

In 2024, preparatory activities were carried out, including the review and approval of the pilot area and the planned ecosystem services to be evaluated and promoted within the Central BIC project.
May 30, 2024 – The Idrija Tourism Institute organized an invasive species removal campaign in the Upper Idrijca Landscape Park (UILP).
In addition, the nature conservation supervisor employed at the Institute dedicated an extra 10 hours to removing invasive species during her regular patrols of the park.
As part of the project Sustainable Food Supply, implemented by ICRA d.o.o., a final conference was held on October 12, 2024, with a focus on landscape preservation — specifically on maintaining the mosaic structure of the landscape.
vironment and Climate
Completion of the construction of the cycling connection between Mokraška vas and Spodnja Idrija and the reconstruction of the main road between Spodnja Idrija and Marof was finalized in 2024. An official inspection and handover of the completed works took place on June 7, 2024. On June 27, 2024, a permit for temporary limited use of the state road was issued, valid until June 1, 2025.
This infrastructure improvement was implemented for the Idrija–Spodnja Idrija cycling route, enhancing both safety and accessibility for cyclists in the area.
Development of the cycling path through Spodnja Idrija and continuation towards Tolmin: For the years 2025 and 2026, funds in the amount of €218,935.00 have been secured, with planned co-financing from the European Cohesion Policy Programme 2021–2027, for the construction of the missing cycling section through the village in Spodnja Idrija, including the renovation of the village square.
The Municipality of Idrija has been implementing energy accounting for public lighting since 2010. The municipality enters data monthly into a dedicated application, based on which the Goriška Local Energy Agency (GOLEA) prepares an annual report.
In September 2024, Komunala Idrija sent an invitation to principals of schools and kindergartens in the municipalities of Idrija and Cerkno to present its activities.
Additionally, high school students from Idrija Grammar School visited one of the water supply systems in Idrija during 2024.
Komunala Idrija regularly publishes notifications, advice, and other information related to drinking water on its official website and Facebook page.
The Municipality of Idrija has developed a Drinking Water Supply Program for the period 2022–2025, which includes a development plan for the public water supply system and a strategy for reducing water losses.

3.7 Wastewater treatment	In 2024, regular monitoring of electricity consumption and the efficient use of chemicals at wastewater treatment plants continued, with monthly record-keeping maintained.
	In June 2024, an open day was held at the Idrija wastewater treatment plant for all schools in the Municipality of Idrija.
	In April 2024, a technical day took place at the Godovič Primary School, featuring a lecture at the school followed by a visit and presentation of the operations at the Godovič wastewater treatment facility.
	In 2024, renovation and construction of new communal infrastructure took place. Some customers have already received connection notices, while most will receive theirs in 2025 after the official handover of the new communal infrastructure.
	The construction of the new Črni Vrh wastewater treatment plant (ČN) was delayed due to the process of obtaining all necessary permits.
	In autumn 2024, construction of new communal infrastructure began on two sections in Črni Vrh: Šolska pot and Park.
	In June 2024, an open day was held at the Idrija wastewater treatment plant (ČN Idrija) for all residents.
	Materials with guidelines on "What Should Not Be Disposed of in the Sewer" were distributed to the citizens.
	On April 20, 2024, Komunala Idrija presented its activities to residents at the Flower Day event organized by the Idrija Town Local Community (KS Mesto Idrija).
	An opening event for the Godovič wastewater treatment plant (KČN Godovič) was organized for the local community, primarily residents of Godovič, in cooperation with the Godovič Primary School (PŠ Godovič).
3.8 Waste Reduction of Solid Waste	Komunala Idrija participated in most major events in Idrija, such as the Idrija Lace Festival and the Idrija Žlikrofi Festival, by providing appropriate bins for separate waste collection.
Cond Waste	In December, they also contributed to the festive decoration of Christmas trees at the Town Square in Idrija, using ornaments made from recycled waste, which were later taken to the Ljubevč Collection Center.
	A cleanup campaign was carried out, along with a flower planting event, workshops for children, presentations by Komunala Idrija and other companies and organizations, and demonstrations of gardening and beekeeping.
	Since 2023, the "Adopt a Christmas Tree" initiative has been taking place in Idrija, started by members of the Idrija Local Community. In December, potted Christmas trees are decorated in the Town Square, making them suitable for reuse year after year.
	Throughout the year, the trees are cared for by adopters — local residents who look after their trees at home until the next season. The decorations are made using recycled materials to promote sustainability.

	In November 2024, as part of the European Week for Waste Reduction (EWWR) and the Za Panucat project, various events were held, including a market for second-hand goods and clothing, multiple workshops, and a free zero-waste hot lunch.
	In 2024, preparations began to establish a collection point for heritage furniture and items, as well as to set up a space for a repair café. The first collection event took place in January 2025, gathering old heritage furniture and objects to be restored and used to furnish public spaces as part of the project. A total of ten workshops focused on reuse will be held throughout the year.
	As part of the Open Day event in June 2024, Komunala Idrija presented a new garbage truck and waste management activities.
	Regularly published announcements, news, and environmental tips on Komunala Idrija's website, Facebook, other media, and on the back of utility bills.
	As part of the "Less is More" project, many activities were carried out in 2024:
	 In February 2024, project partners participated in a professional consultation on compost in Ptuj. In August 2024, a workshop on building compost heaps and testing compost from last year's compost heap was held in Vojsko. In October 2024, farms and providers involved in the project took part in a study trip to Ptuj to observe good practices for preserving and improving soil humus content.
	 Also in October 2024, partners from the Local Action Groups (LAS) with CIL and four other Slovenian LAS participated in a study trip to Ireland to explore projects supporting local community development.
3.12 Reducing greenhouse gas emissions	The Municipality of Idrija has secured the necessary funding for the renovation of the Modra Dvorana (Blue Hall), with the renovation scheduled for 2025.
to mitigate climate change	On public street lighting, 900 lamps were replaced with more energy-efficient ones.
ominate change	The installation of a 100 kW solar power plant at the Idrija Health Center is planned.
3.13 Reducing emissions from tourism-related travel	For several years, the town of Idrija has operated a municipal e-bike rental system, while the cycling network is continuously being expanded. A transport service for the elderly, called Sopotniki, is active, and the municipality has six charging stations for electric vehicles. Numerous projects and campaigns promoting sustainable mobility are underway, which we have detailed in other sections.
	Additionally, a traffic management study for the historic part of Idrija is currently in preparation.
3.14 Sustainable	During the summer season, free bus transport was organized within the Zgornja Idrijca Landscape Park on the routes Črni Vrh–Lajšt and Idrija–Lajšt.
mobility	In 2024, the Idrija Tourist Board acquired six e-bikes as part of the Danube Geotour+ project, which will be available for free rental to visitors.
	Additionally, new visitor monitoring counters were installed in the landscape park by the Idrija Tourist Board, including counters for motor vehicles, cyclists, and pedestrians.

	As every year, Idrija actively participated in the European Mobility Week 2024.
	During the European Mobility Week, various events took place between 16 and 20 September 2024:
	 16.9.2024 – Activities for children at the Town Square with the Bičikleta Theatre, 16.9.2024 – Transport action for seniors "Mayors behind the wheel," 20.9.2024 – Breakfast on the route for cyclists riding the Idrija–Spodnja Idrija cycling path, 20.9.2024 – Artistic performance about mobility at Idrija Primary School, 20.9.2024 – Safe riding demonstration at the Pump Track, 20.9.2024 – Presentation of the preparation of the new Comprehensive Traffic Strategy of the Municipality of Idrija.
	The Car-Free Weekend in the Upper idrijca Landscape Park took place on June 29 and 30, 2024.
	On Saturday, June 29, 2024, the program ran from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM, featuring a presentation on hunting and hunting activities.
	On Sunday, June 30, the program began with an exhibition of drawings by children from kindergartens in the Municipality of Idrija on the theme "Nature Conservation," followed by various activities mainly for children and families.
	Both days included catering services and free bus transportation from Idrija and Črni Vrh.
	The bEcikl city e-bike rental system has been well received in Idrija and has many regular users. The number of users in 2024 remained stable compared to 2023, but the total number of individual bike rentals decreased in 2024.
	The Municipality of Idrija continuously informs the public about news, updates, events, and other topics related to sustainable mobility (such as information about public transport, events, new arrangements, etc.).
	In March 2024, a meeting of the Goriška Regional Council was held with Minister Bratušek, who promised the prompt implementation of the project to mark the national cycling network in the region.
	By December 31, 2024, the markings had not been completed.
	The LAMO project started on October 1, 2024. Since the Idrija municipality budget was approved in January, most activities will be carried out starting from 2025. A few Zoom meetings were held in 2024.
	In the first half of 2025, the purchase of electric bicycles (15 bikes and 5 stations) is planned.
3.15 Public transport	Since 2020, the Municipality of Idrija has subsidized the city bus transport, and the public tender for 2024 was also conducted and completed. The bus was subsidized until June 30, 2024 (passengers paid a fare of €0.50, covering approximately 10% of the total cost, with the remainder covered by the Municipality of Idrija).
	From July 1, 2024, the city bus service was classified as part of public scheduled transport under the administration of DUJPP. The Idrija-Podroteja-Idrija loop, which is not part of intercity transport, is financed by the Municipality of Idrija. Passengers pay the ticket according to the operator's valid price list, which partially covers the municipality's costs.

	The Municipality of Idrija provided residents of the Črnovrška Plateau with free bus transport to the 2024 New Year's Eve celebration held in Spodnja Idrija. A free New Year's Eve bus service was also available between Idrija and Spodnja Idrija.
3.16 Reducing energy consumption	For several years, free energy consulting has been available in Idrija through the advisory office EN SVET. Consultations are offered by prior appointment. The contact number is published on the municipal website and the Eko sklad website.
3.19 Responses to climate risks	 The development agency ICRA d.o.o. has been involved in preparing the regional climate change adaptation strategy: Preparation of data for the included area and proposals of measures for climate change adaptation for the Northern Primorska region. Preparation of data and documents for the development of the Climate Change Adaptation Strategy for the Northern Primorska region. Participation in the expert workshop for the preparation of the Climate Change Adaptation Strategy for the Goriška Development Region on December 3, 2024. The event was attended by a representative of ICRA and a representative of the Idrija Tourism Institute.
3.20 Informing about climate change	The Municipality of Idrija has prepared the Sustainable Energy and Climate Action Plan (SECAP) and the Local Energy Concept (LEK) plan, and they are both published on the municipal website.
4. Cu	Iture and tradition
4.1 Immovable Cultural Heritage	Meetings of the international and national committees are organized at least once a year. In 2024, two sessions of the international committee and one session of the national committee were held. During the national committee session, a position was adopted regarding the mandatory preparation of a Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA) for interventions involving cultural monuments protected as UNESCO heritage. On World Tourism Day, September 27, we hosted UNESCO Day 2024 in Idrija, which we organized together with the Slovenian National Commission for UNESCO at the Idrija Tourism Board.

CUDHg Idrija has started developing the unfinished space on the 3rd floor of the Klasirnica building, which was not part of Phase I of the renovation and revitalization of the Hg Smelting Plant. The goal is to adapt the space in accordance with the project documentation and building permit for the purposes of museum exhibitions, school and other educational programs, as well as workshops and events.

Renovation has also begun on the corroded ore chutes above the conveyor belt, located in the basement connecting tunnel between the Visitors' Centre and the Klasirnica. This project aims to preserve an important part of the equipment used for transporting ore to the roasting furnaces.

Regular maintenance is ongoing in the underground mine areas, including water pumping from the mine and monitoring the impact zone of the former mercury mine.

Numerous events were organized by CUDHq to raise public awareness about mining heritage, including:

- Rudnik oživi (The Mine Comes Alive),
- Odsevi srebrnega časa (Reflections of the Silver Era),
- a concert on St. Barbara's Day (patron saint of miners),
- the annual mass in the Chapel of the Holy Trinity in Anthony's Shaft on St. Ahac's Day,
- and events on Idrija Municipal Day, June 22.

The Idrija Municipal Museum also carried out a variety of activities:

- Renovation of the entrance doors at Gewerkenegg Castle (3 units), value: €5,803.42
- Partial energy renovation: insulation of the attic in Wing A of Gewerkenegg Castle (154 m²), value: €13,304.89
- Sandblasting and painting of the water supply pipe and pumping rods of the Idrija waterwheel, value: €11,496.06
- Replacement of the railing on the staircase of Gewerkenegg Castle, value: €1,378.50

5.6 Accessibility	In 2024, the Municipality of Idrija joined the project "Enabling Multimodal Mobility", implemented by the Geodetic Institute of Slovenia.		
	On October 22, 2024, a regional event related to the project took place in Idrija, focusing on enabling mobility for persons with disabilities. The event featured presentations of good practices in accessibility, and participants discussed the daily challenges faced by people with disabilities as well as potential improvements.		
	In 2024, we created a dedicated subpage on visit-idrija.si about the accessibility of the most important tourist attractions. In 2025, we will add a link to the Public Accessibility Viewer and guidelines currently being prepared as part of the Events for All project, implemented by MC Idrija.		
	As part of the Wild Points project, an informational board adapted for the blind and visually impaired was installed at Divje Lake in 2024. In 2024, two smaller events were held:

Economic Effects	
5.12 Support for Local Entrepreneurs hip	Since we included the sale of local products in the Wild Points project, which will be implemented in the coming years, we only had an informational booth at Divje Lake during the season, where visitors received information about: • Waste management in the Idrija Mercury Heritage Site (KPZI) • Proper behavior within the KPZI • Tourist attractions in the KPZI • Parking rules in the KPZI • Public transportation in the KPZI
	In 2024, regulations, contracts, and other relevant documents of the Idrija Selected collective trademark were updated due to the introduction of membership fees and changes in the certification area.
	A study tour was organized for certified providers to the destination Heart of Slovenia, where good practices in provider collaboration and development of tourist experiences were presented.
	The Idrija Tourist Board successfully entered the Made in Slovenia gift catalog with products certified by bobbin lace. This online catalog showcases visual and design excellence as well as the identity and heritage of Slovenia and the national brands I Feel Slovenia and Made in Slovenia (https://www.madeinslovenia.design/).
	We were also successful in the tender for selecting protocol gifts for the European Capital of Culture 2025 – GO25!, where the bobbin lace bracelet Prepletena was chosen.
	Selected products were presented as gifts for business partners: Lace from Ljubljana to Idrija was a gift for partners of the Slovenian Tourist Board (STO), and the bee brooch was given to partners of NLB. In all these projects, the Idrija Tourist Board closely collaborated with pattern designers and lace makers, whose contribution is essential for the high quality of the final products.
	The call for certification of Idrija izbrano was re-announced in 2024. A total of 18 providers applied (10 new and 8 with new products). The first evaluation, held on May 7, focused on food and beverages served in catering style, while the second evaluation on October 8 assessed handicraft products and experiences. The commission reviewed and evaluated a total of 82 products and services. Some products received recommendations for improvements, mostly related to packaging. Due to the required improvements, 12 providers with 59 products or services were awarded the certificate in 2024.
	Regular certificate renewals were also carried out – food products every two years, handicrafts every three years. The commission paid special attention to product improvements based on previous recommendations, resulting in all 34 evaluated products and services successfully renewing their certificates.

As part of the idrija Selected collective brand, individual consultations for product design and refinement were conducted in April 2024 for providers wishing to newly join or include new products under the Idrija Selected collective brand. Additionally, online consultations for providers of gastronomic dishes, beverages, and experiences were held in April and May 2024.

Many activities were also carried out by ICRA d.o.o.:

- Organization of the Barbara Fair, featuring local artisans and a wide range of handicraft products, co-organized with the KS Mesto Idrija, on November 30, 2024 (Mestni trg, Idrija),
- Establishment of the Wool Craft Atelier, in cooperation with the Handicraft Section of the Idrija-Cerkno Small Livestock Breeders Association: first held on Saturday, October 12, 2024, during the 20th Farmer's Market (location: Mestni trg 3, business premises owned by the Municipality of Idrija), and again on Friday, November 29, and Saturday, November 30, during the festive Barbara Fair (Mestni trg 3, business premises owned by the Municipality of Idrija),
- Coordination and expert cooperation with the Handicraft Section of the Idrija-Cerkno Small Livestock Breeders Association throughout the year,
- Inclusion of the joint section (Idrija-Cerkno) in the development and programs of events such as LARFA ART Wood and Handicraft Festival (Cerkno, July 2024) and others.
- Implementation of the educational program WEAVING SCHOOL, 40 hours, IPO programs, 2024,
- Implementation of the educational program DEVELOPMENT OF NEW HANDICRAFT PRODUCTS FROM WOOL, 60 hours, IPO programs, 2024.

The Idrija-Cerkno Development Agency also implemented two projects in 2024 with a strong focus on transitioning to nature-friendly food supply: the Transition to Nature-Friendly Food Supply project and the PRO EKO project.

Within the Nature-Friendly Food Supply project, numerous activities were carried out:

- Promotion of producers of organically and nature-friendly grown food production of a video (Tine Mažgon),
- Workshops on making Idrija žlikrofi from organic ingredients (February 29, 2024, March 2024),
- Final project conference held on October 12, 2024, with an emphasis on landscape preservation,
- Presentation of local nature-friendly food offerings at the covered market in April 2024 and at the large farmer's market in October 2024.

Within the PRO EKO project:

- Testing of innovation for deterring wildlife from agricultural fields at the farm of Roka Likar in Vojsko,
- Study visit of good practices at the organic farm of young successor Roka Likar in Vojsko,
- Presentation of the tourist program of Roka Likar's farm,
- In May 2024, Serbian partners were hosted in Idrija; local providers involved in the project and the Idrija-Cerkno Small Livestock Breeders Association were introduced.

	The public call for granting state aid to preserve and promote the development of agriculture and rural areas in the Municipality of Idrija for 2024 was published on July 24, 2024. A total of €40,000 was available under the call, divided into several measures, including: Measure 4: Aid for investments in the processing and marketing of agricultural and food products, as well as investments in non-agricultural activities on farms. Within this measure, €5,000 was allocated; however, in 2024, no applicants applied for this call. As part of the project, six sets of learning materials were prepared to develop entrepreneurial skills for artisans and creators in the field of heritage. In October and November 2024, educational workshops were held on cultural entrepreneurship, marketing skills, using mobile
	phones to create visual content for social media, as well as on networking, seeking financial and professional support, and event organization. At the conclusion of the project, the workshop participants connected with other local creators (a total of 16 providers) and jointly co-organized a holiday market.
5.13 Promotion of Local	Promotion of products under the Idrija selected collective brand took place throughout the year. It included:

5.14 Promoting Careers in Tourism	In 2024, the Idrija Tourism Board enrolled in a practical training program. A student from the Secondary School for Gastronomy and Tourism in Ljubljana participated in practical training at the Tourist Information Center during 2024. The internship took place from December 1, 2024, to December 24, 2024.
5.18 Protection and Rescue Plans	In 2022 and 2023, the Idrija municipality area was affected by five severe storms, which caused flooding or damage to buildings, and also triggered several landslides and earth slips threatening residential houses and public infrastructure.
	In 2023 and 2024, due to the need to address the consequences of these natural disasters, all activities related to updating plans were suspended, with focus shifted to damage assessment, damage reporting, preparation of remediation projects, and implementation of the most urgent repairs. In total, 12 houses and 138 public infrastructure objects were damaged or threatened.

In the first half of 2023, the Municipality of Idrija repaired two public paths, one local road, and a bridge at Divje jezero, all damaged in the October 2022 storm, and also renovated a public shelter under the Spodnja Idrija Primary School. From May 15 to October 7, the Idrija Civil Protection carried out emergency interventions to ensure temporary stabilization of landslides, road passability, and clearing of debris from affected buildings.

In 2024, the Idrija Civil Protection implemented a remediation program according to remediation projects and reports, addressing the following most critical landslides and damaged public infrastructure:

- Landslide at Bazoviška 4 in Idrija, threatening two residential houses and the Mining House (cultural heritage),
- Landslide at Bazoviška 6,8 in Idrija, threatening two residential houses,
- Landslide at Tolminska cesta 50 in the Spodnja Idrija Local Community, threatening one residential house and one agricultural building,
- Landslide at Mrzli Vrh 20 in the Ledine Local Community, threatening one residential house,
- Landslide at Spodnja Kanomlja 46A, threatening one residential house (remediation to be completed early 2025).
- Landslide at Moraška vas, threatening water supply infrastructure, gas pipeline, electricity power line, and telephone and optical networks (remediation to be completed early 2025),
- Earth slip under the Smukovše public road in Idrija, the only access road for multiple residential houses,
- Earth slip under the Ledinske Krnice Ledine local road,
- Bevk Slanice water supply for the town of Idrija,
- Local roads and public roads listed with their designations, including:

In 2025, remediation of 15 public paths and local roads is ongoing according to the natural disaster aftermath removal program.

6. Tourism Enterprises and Communication

6.1 Promotion of Sustainability in the Tourism Sector	In 2023, we created the Green Newsletter for providers, in which we presented various sustainability topics and information. In 2024, five issues of the Green Newsletter were published (March, June, August, November, and December). We plan to continue preparing the Green Newsletter in the coming years as well.
6.2 Sustainability certificates	A more detailed presentation of sustainability certificates was included in the content of the Green Newsletter, where each issue featured one of the certification marks.
6.3 Publication of Certified Providers	Our currently only certified provider – Hotel Jožef – is featured on the destination website in the restaurant and accommodation sections. It is listed among the top positions. All events organized by the provider are also published on the visit-idrija.si website. In 2024, the international sustainability label Travelife was awarded to the provider Sever Turizem. We announced this achievement in the Green Newsletter and decorated the provider's photo on the website with the awarded label.
6.4 Water Use in Tourism Businesses	In 2024, raising awareness about the rational use of drinking water was included in several issues of the Green Newsletter. In July, we also prepared a separate publication titled "Let's Drink Tap Water!", which we sent to providers in a dedicated campaign and published on the Visit Idrija Facebook page.
6.5 Waste Management in Tourism Businesses	These topics will continue to be covered in future issues of the Idrija Green Newsletter. In the Green Newsletter, we published tips on sustainable gardening and composting.
6.6 Energy Use in Tourism Businesses	The topic of efficient energy use was addressed in the August issue of the Green Newsletter. This topic will be explored in more detail in upcoming issues of the Idrija Green Newsletter.
6.9 Code of Conduct for Tour Guides, Agencies, and Travel Organizers	In 2024, the Idrija Tourist Board prepared an update of the Code of Conduct for local tour guides.
6.10 Respectful and	We conduct promotion in the Idrija destination in accordance with ethical and sustainability criteria. Our advertising is clear, respectful, and non-deceptive; we ensure transparency of prices and conditions and respect personal data protection. The promotion is also sustainability-oriented, focusing on digital marketing, promoting boutique experiences, sustainable activities and products, and local authenticity, as evident from our communications.

6.12 Interpretative Content	In autumn 2024, an informational board with printed content and a QR code providing access to digital informational materials about Feldban was installed. Additionally, two directional posts were placed at the entry point and along the trail (at the top of Ključe).
	In 2024, within the Upper Idrijca Landscape Park, three entrance signs and three informational boards were replaced in accordance with the unified graphic design of the protected area. On one informational board, the wooden supports were also replaced. These installations were carried out in June 2024.
